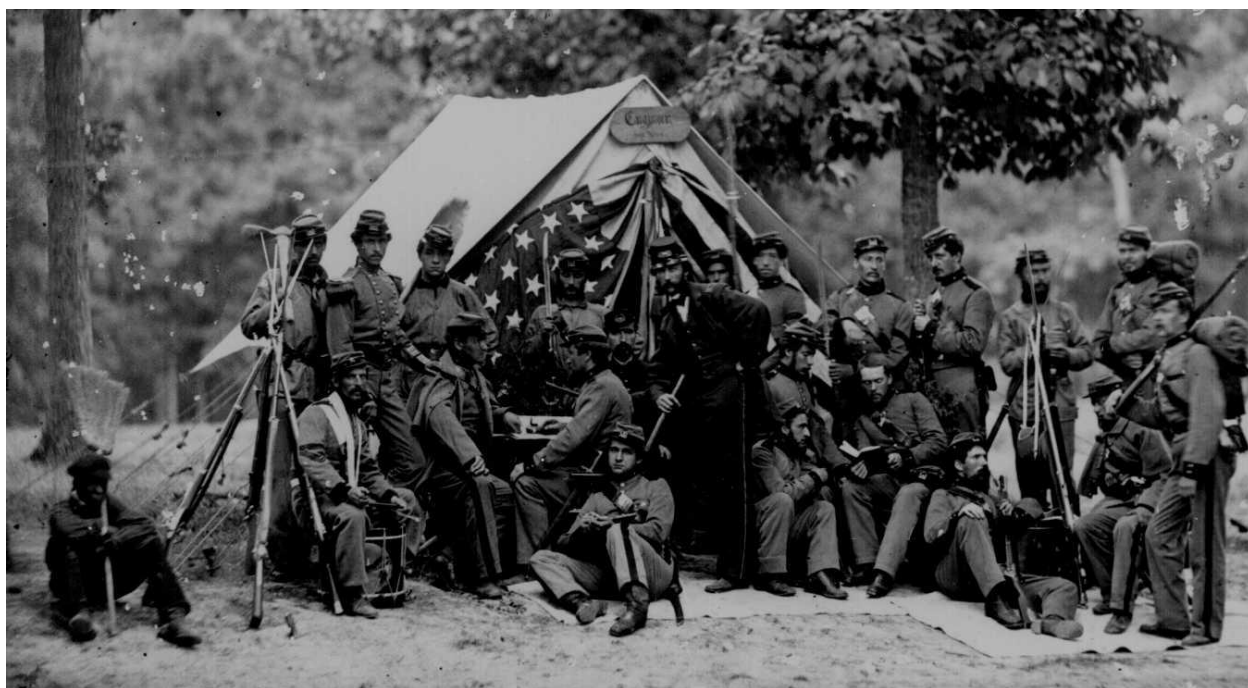

## BlogBook

A blogbook is a series of posted blogs, collected and organized into a format resembling a book. It's not as scholarly as a published book, and it doesn't pretend to be. It isn't as well researched, written, documented, or edited. It isn't held to the same high standards as a published book, and since the author isn't trying to sell it, there is no profit motive.

Those are reasons one should read a blogbook (if at all) with a great deal of skepticism. But they are also the very reasons why you might want to at least consider what a blogbook has to say. Since the author has very few restrictions (if any) on what he says or how he (or she) says it, a blogbook can express ideas, facts, and opinions that a professional author is not willing or allowed to write, no matter how strongly felt, true, or valid. A blogbook can candidly explore issues and questions that published authors would consider a professional or political third rail.

Why would a blogbook author waste time writing something that no one will (or can) buy, and few will even read, unless he/she is convinced that it is something that needs to be said, and no one else is saying it? Of course, it may be all or mostly nonsense, but that is true of published books and speeches, as well. You can usually get a pretty good sense right away whether a blogbook is worth spending time on.
